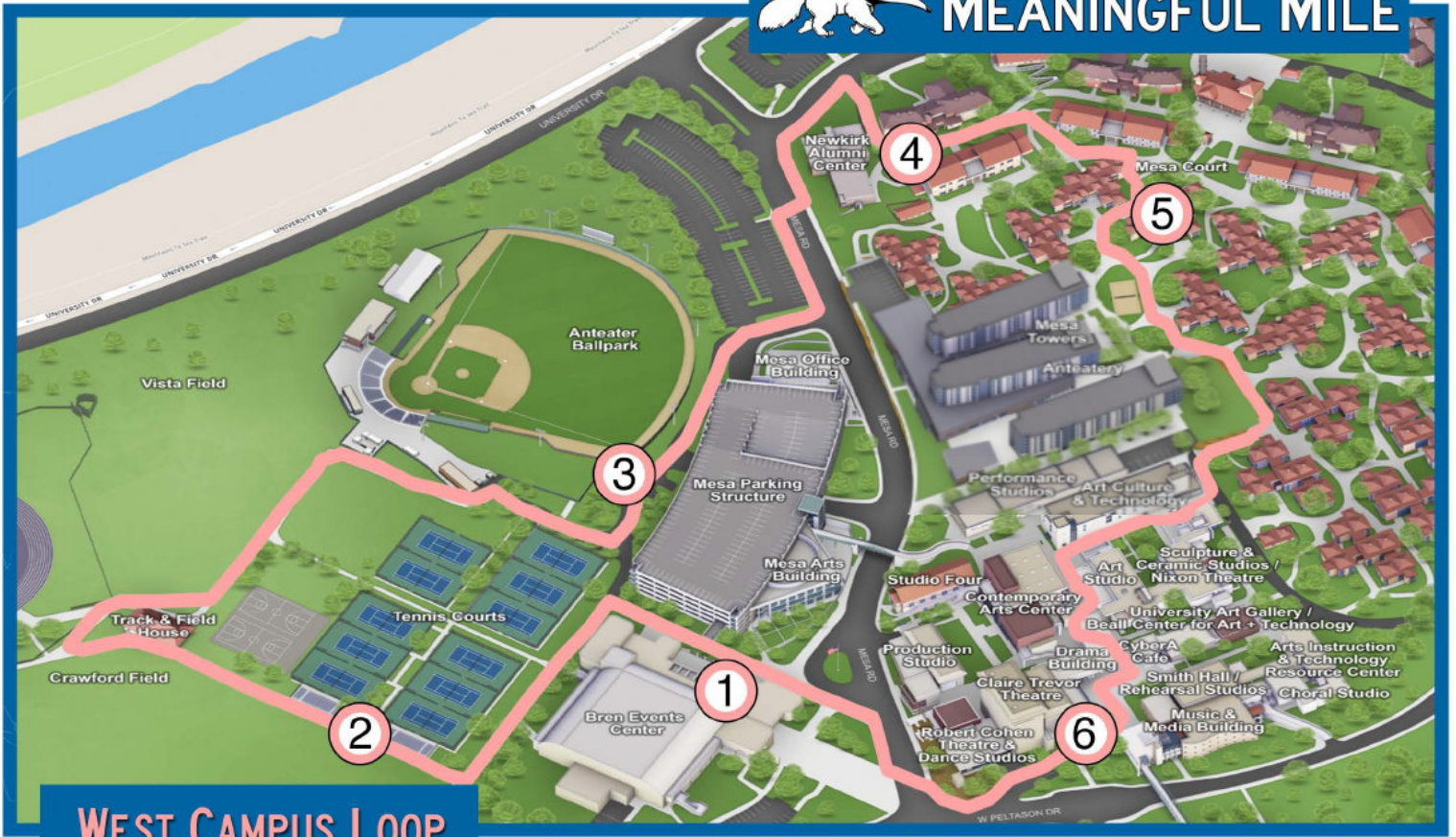

1 Bren Event Center

Conceived and planned in 1981, the Bren opened on January 8, 1987 with UCI Men's Basketball vs. Utah State. The Bren is an indoor arena seating 6,000 people. It has hosted numerous athletic programs, concerts, conventions, and graduation ceremonies. Find the water tower for a nice surprise!

2 Tennis Courts

UCI Tennis Stadium has 11 championship tennis courts, six of which can be used at night with stadium lighting. The Lloyd Ross grandstands can seat up to 500 spectators. Both men's and women's tennis programs have developed Big West Conference champions and NCAA competitors.

3 Anteater Ballpark

Anteater Ballpark arguably rates as one of the top collegiate baseball facilities on the West Coast, opened in 2002, seating 908 guests and can accommodate up to 2,500 people on a grass berm. Affectionately dubbed "The Anthill", is home to the UC Irvine baseball team who made its mark in history on June 26, 2007 with its first College World Series. On May 01, 2014 the UC Irvine baseball team made it to their second College World Series.

4 Newkirk Alumni Center

A donation by Martha and James Newkirk made it possible for UCI to begin construction on a much-needed center that will allow alumni to return to campus to reconnect, network, and stay involved.

5 Mesa

Mesa Court is a 1st year housing community with 29 halls. It was the first residence hall community at UCI and named Mesa Court because it is built on a natural mesa. Features in Mesa Court include the Mesa Commons dining facility, Recreation Center, Mesa Activity Center, and the Community Center. In fall 2016, Mesa Court opened 3 new halls with six floors each.

6 Claire Trevor Theatre

Claire Trevor School of the Arts is an academic Unit at UCI focused on performing and visual arts. The four departments are comprised of the arts, dance, drama, and music. One of the unique aspects about the school is that many classes are taught by artists-in-residence.
